Rules of Entry

- Everyone mounted, whether competing or not **MUST** wear protective Riding Hat conforming to the current British Standard with a British Kite Mark. The Show would advise that all those competing In-hand should wear a Hat to the same standard, see specific Society Rules for requirements – if you choose not to wear a Riding Hat whilst showing In-hand, *you do so at your own risk.*
- *No Horse or Pony to be left unattended, tied to Lorry, Horse Box or Trailer.*
- *No cars to be parked among lorries, horse boxes or trailers.*
- **ALL HORSE PASSPORTS MUST BE WITH YOU ON SHOW DAY – SPOT CHECKS MAY TAKE PLACE.**

IN FAIRNESS TO ALL:

1. Horse, Rider or Handler may not exhibit in any class where the Judge has in the past, bred, owned, produced or given paid or voluntary instruction to the Horse, Rider or Handler.
2. Any Horse or pony found to be over height for a specific class may not take part in that class – NO entry fees will be refunded and no substitution of animal or class change will be allowed.
3. Any person wishing to report a 'breach of conduct' concerning an exhibitor – please report to the Chief Steward or Show Secretary.
4. **Classes will not be held up for those competing in other rings or classes and no entry fees will be refunded for classes that have been missed.**

The organisers and landowners do not accept any liability for accident or damage, injury or illness to horses, riders, ground spectators or any other persons or property.

- The organisers hold the right to amalgamate, alter or cancel any of the classes;
- Verification of horse/pony age and height must be available on request
- It is **STRONGLY** recommended that all horses and ponies have Equine Influenza and Tetanus vaccinations.
- Handler of any Stallion or Colt must be 14 years old or over. Stallion discs to be worn
- **Handlers of ponies in In-hand classes aged 14 years and under must wear a correctly secured skull cap or riding hat which meets current regulations.**
- No ill-treatment of ponies or horses at any time, whether by misuse or excessive use of whip, bit, item of saddlery or in any other way whatsoever.
- A fall of horse, pony or rider in **any** class will result in disqualification. The rider **MUST NOT** remount in the ring.
- The rider or handler may not remove their pony or themselves from the ring during judging, without the judge's permission. The class ends when the judge dismisses the class.
- No unauthorised persons to enter the arenas.
- Riders, handlers and their grooms must, at all times, present themselves in the show ring neatly and smartly dressed.
- The class is closed to competitors once the ring gate is shut. As long as the gate has not been closed a late entry to a class may be accepted, but the competitor **must get an official late entry card** for the secretary's tent.
- Competitors may enter as many classes as they wish or want. However, if the classes clash the competitor must pick which class takes preference.
- Any Competitor or groom guilty of disobedience or rudeness towards any judge, steward or official shall be disqualified and asked to leave the showground. Entry fees will not be refunded.
- Side reins, draw reins or grass reins are not permitted when riding on the showground.
- Anyone found galloping around the arenas or on the showground shall be asked to leave immediately.
- Correct hat and boots must be worn when mounted anywhere on the showground
- Complaints or objections must be logged in writing within 30 minutes immediately following completion of the class.
- All dogs on the show fields must be on a short lead and under control
- In the event of a fatality of a horse on the show field, within sight of the public, then the show may be cancelled.
- **THE JUDGES DECISION IS FINAL AND WITHOUT APPEAL.**

Please note there will not be a farrier on the field during the show.

A photographer may be in attendance. Competitors may be photographed and images may be published on social media etc. Any objections to photos being published should be submitted to the Secretary prior to the show.

NPS SCOTLAND QUALIFIERS – RULES 2026

To be run under NPS SCOTLAND CHAMPIONSHIPS RULES 2026. These rules clarify areas particular to NPS Scotland. We also run to the Rules of the National Pony Society. Copies of these rules can be found on our website www.npsscotland.co.uk

Exhibitors are deemed to be conversant with these rules.

A judge is not obliged to award an NPS Scotland Qualification if he/she feels the pony is not of a sufficient standard.

NPS Scotland/Townhead Pet N Pony In Hand Mountain & Moorland Championship.

Youngstock, stallions, mares and geldings registered in the main body of their respective Breed Society stud book

In Hand M&M Championships: The Champion & Res. Champion in all Mixed, pure-bred M & M, or Breed Championships will qualify for the Final which will take place at the Scone Palace International Horse Trials on Friday 28th August 2026.

Qualification may go to 3rd in the Championship (i.e. 1st Reserve Champion)

NPS Scotland/Kilmannan Stud Novice Ridden Mountain and Moorland Championship

Stallions, mares and geldings four years old and over, registered in the main body of their respective Breed Society stud book.

A pony is not eligible to compete if, before 1st January in the current year, it has done any of the following:

- i Won an open affiliated mixed M&M Ridden class
- ii Qualified for Horse of the Year Show, LIHS or RIHS Open M&M Ridden classes
- iii Qualified for the M&M Novice or Intermediate Ridden final at the NPS Summer Championship show and the NPS Scotland/Kilmannan Stud Novice Finals (N.B. Ponies can compete as novices in this competition for two consecutive years provided they do not submit an entry to the final in the first year).
- iv. If a pony qualifies for Horse of the Year Show, LIHS or RIHS in its second year it is de-noviced and cannot compete in the Kilmannan Final at Scone Final.

A minimum of 6 ponies must be stripped in qualifying rounds. All ponies will be stripped in the Final.

The **2** highest placed ponies, not already qualified, in each class will qualify for the Final which will take place at the Scone Palace International Horse Trials on Friday 28th August 2026. **Qualifications to go no lower than 4th place.** This can be either mixed M & M or Breed Classes.

NPS Scotland/Harbro Open Ridden Mountain & Moorland Championship.

Stallions, mares and geldings five years old and over, registered in the main body of their respective Breed Society stud book.

The **2** highest placed ponies, not already qualified, will qualify for the Final which will take place at the Scone Palace International Horse Trials on Friday 28th August 202.

Qualifications to go no lower than 4th place.

NPS Scotland/ Craigclowan School M&M Lead Rein Championship

The 2 highest placed ponies in the Lead Rein Class not already qualified will go forward to the final which will take place at the Scone Palace International Horse Trials on Friday 28th August 2026. **Qualifications to go no lower than 4th place**

Mares and geldings four years old and over not exceeding 122 cms, registered in the main body of the following Breed Society stud books:

Dartmoor, Exmoor, Shetland, New Forest, Welsh A and Welsh B. To be shown in a snaffle bit.

Riders must be at least 3 years old on the day of the class and not to have attained their 9th birthday by the 1st January in the current year.

The 2 highest placed ponies in the First ridden class not already qualified will go forward to the final which will take place at the Scone Palace International Horse Trials on Friday 28th August 2026. **Qualifications to go no lower than 4th place.**

Dartmoor, Exmoor, Shetland, New Forest, Welsh A and Welsh B.

Horse & Country Racehorse Membership

The Horse & Country Racehorses (HCR) series is open to Thoroughbreds and Standardbreds who have raced, trained or been bred to race. Racing injuries will be ignored provided the horse is sound. Riders must be 14 years plus, ridden horses must be 4 years plus and veterans are 12 years plus. Judges will not ride and you will not be asked to gallop as a ride but maybe asked to gallop in your individual show.

Qualifying shows are open to members and non-members.

In order to qualify for the HCR Champion Show at Netherpton Equestrian, Perth on 5th/6th September 2026:

- HCR members must carry their cards in the ring for signing at qualifying shows and be placed 1st-4th (Qualifications may be passed down to 6th place)
- Non members must send their qualification cards (presented by the judge if placed 1st-4th(6th)), fees and register with HCR before the entries close for the HCR Championship show.

Highland Pony Society Youngstock Championships 2026

- This show is a qualifier for the 2026 Highland Pony Society Youngstock Championships.
- The Champion youngster across classes 29,30 and 31 will qualify for the Highland Pony Youngstock Championships. If already qualified, the card will pass to the second placed pony but no further.
- Only pure bred registered Highland youngstock; foals, 1,2, and 3yrs olds may enter.
- Two Championships will be held; one in Scotland (CSHPC Show at Strathallan Castle on 6th September) and one in England in September 2026 – venue tbc).
- Exhibitors are not required to be members of the Highland Pony Society for qualifying classes. However, all those competing in the Championships must be members of the Society.
- Entry to the Championships is free.
- At the Youngstock Championships, the Champions and Reserves will receive rosettes and prize money of £100 and £50 respectively and all those forward at the final will receive £15 and a finalist rosette. A sash and perpetual trophy will be awarded to each of the Champions.
- **New for 2026** Additional awards will be presented at the Finals to recognise the best foal, best yearling, best 2 year old, best female, best colt and best gelding.

Junior Awards 2026

- This show is a qualifier from the exciting new 2026 Highland Pony Society Junior Handler Final.
- All Juniors aged under 18 on 1st January showing a pure bred registered Highland pony in an In Hand class at a show affiliated to the Highland Pony Society will receive a Junior Award Card and automatically qualify for the final.
- Juniors do not need to be a member of the Highland Pony Society to qualify or to enter the final.

- The final will be held at the CSHPC Summer Show on Sunday 6th September 2026 at Strathallan Castle, Auchterader, Perthshire.
- Entry to the final is free.
